TCCSevilla PROFESSOR PRESENTS AT CAWL

Professor Salvador Gallego de la Rosa represented the TCCS evilla faculty at the 29th Annual Christian Association of World Languages (CAWL) Conference, hosted this year by Baylor University. Salva presented his lecture, La templanza como virtud imposible en el héroe romántico. He provides this summary of his work: "After taking a tour through the most interesting passages of Spanish romanticism, we discover that lack of temperance is one of the defining characteristics of the romantic hero, a circumstance that will help the teacher, along with their students, to reflect on this sadly forgotten virtue in present times." INTERNSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

To enrich her International Relations and Spanish majors, Anthea extended her semester to include our May internship. Anthea received first-hand experience in Spanish politics while she worked side-by-side with Sevilla's mayoral candidate Beltran Perez. She canvassed the streets, spoke to locals at campaign events, worked in the beautiful Ayuntamiento de Sevilla, and navigated the challenging structure of the Spanish government system with its pacts, majorities, and opposition parties. Although Perez did not win the election, Anthea no doubt had a winning experience!



May internships are available as an extension of the spring semester to students who have taken advanced coursework. Summer Term 2 Internships are also available for students who have taken advanced courses during Summer Term 1. Internships are typically four weeks and provide at least 80 clock hours of experience. We have an expansive network for internship partners, and enjoy placing students in meaningful contexts that help meet their vocational goals. Examples include business, social services, education, ministry, non-profit, political science, special needs, and communication disorders.
