



# Semester in Spain Student FAQs

*Preguntas más frecuentes de estudiantes*



**How many credits can I earn when I study abroad?**

For a **semester** students can earn **12-18 credits**. For a **summer** students can earn **4-6 credits**, per four-week term.

A **semester** is **16 weeks**. There are two, **four-week terms** in **summer**. *Students can participate multiple semesters and in both Term 1 and 2 should they choose.*

**Are classes taught in Spanish or English?**

The **language of instruction** is **always Spanish**. All classes, coursework, excursions *y más* utilize the language.

**No**. Host families are committed to preparing students three meals a day, seven days a week. *Cost is included in room & board fee.*

**Will I need to meal plan while studying abroad?**



**Will I have insurance coverage while studying abroad?**

**Yes**. All students have robust medical, dental and mental health insurance. Students also have access to free online counseling. *Cost is included in tuition fee.*

**Students often** are placed with a **roommate**. All homestay families are vetted. *To request single placement, there is an additional fee.*

**Will I have a roommate or will I live on my own?**



**What if I have a food allergy, sensitivity or intolerance?**

**Students will list these on their application**. The program can accommodate vegetarian, pescatarian, gluten free, lactose free and egg free. *These are an additional cost.*

**Student spending varies**. We recommend students budget and save for costs not covered by the program like personal travel, eating out, attending local festivals, events *y más*.

Students can expect **weekends** to be available. Semester students will be given a **week long break** from classes. **Spanish holidays** are also built into the calendar.
